The national STEMM awards

STEMM stands for Science, Technology, Engineering, Mathematics and Medicine. A new national scheme enables primary and secondary pupils to work towards bronze, silver and gold awards. Pupils have to build up hours spent developing their own knowledge and introducing others to the STEMM subjects. County **Upper** was one of the first thirty schools nationally to get involved and this term students working towards their silver award have run a special science and computing club for pupils at Tollgate campus. This allows the Tollgate pupils to be amongst the first to work towards the new primary award. The County Upper students have done an excellent job of planning and running the sessions while the Tollgate pupils have impress with their enthusiasm and ability.
