Meanwhile, both Horringer Court and County Upper held their annual Charity Campaigns. Horringer Court raised a fantastic £5,632, while at County Upper students raised £15,764 taking the total through the £350,000 barrier since the charity weeks began.





#### **Music Success**

Specialist teaching across the Trust is a real strength and our pupils of all ages benefit from this. Two recent successes highlight this. Firstly, **William Russell at Westley** became the youngest person ever to be awarded the Royal School of Church Music's; 'Voice for Life' Gold Award. Westley choirs and instrumental ensembles go from 'Strength to strength' under the leadership of **Mrs Hart**. We



were also delighted that the quality and quantity of music at **County Upper** and its impact on our wider trust has been further recognised with another **national award** in January from the UK Association for Music Education in conjunction with Arts Council England. ## The Modern Languages Day

County Upper was praised by the British Council last term for its uptake and results in languages, being **one of the top fifty schools nationally**. This is shared in various ways across the Trust including **German lessons** taught at both Horringer Court and Westley; a weekly **Latin club** for the middle phase and a shared languages group across the schools. This half term students from Westley and Horringer had a **taster day** learning some **Japanese**, **Latin and Spanish**. The activities were prepared by our sixth form captains of languages and **Wilf Harvey** helped with their delivery. The pupils picked up the languages very quickly and all received certificate to mark how well they had done. We congratulate them and thank **Mrs Browning, Mr Goodchild and Mr Hopkins** for an excellent experience.



#### **The Chinese New Year**

We marked this across the phases with an assembly in the upper phase and a range of activities in the first and middle phases. At Tollgate, pupils spent a week looking at Chinese culture and how the New Year is celebrated. They ended the week with a **dragon** parade. In the middle phase, year seven students organised a variety of activities to celebrate the year of the rat. They made lanterns and book marks and held a chopstick race in some very well organised lunchtime sessions. Everyone enjoyed learning about a very different culture and took part enthusiastically.
