### Severe Weather Conditions

Although the weather remains mild, obviously January and February are the most likely months for snow.

In the event of a school closure because of bad weather, the following arrangements will apply:

- a) Early closure during the day: this would be a very unusual occurrence and would normally only happen if the bus contractors asked to run the buses early because there was a fear of worsening weather conditions. We would assume that students sent home early would be able to get into their home or that of a friend/neighbour/relative. If this gives any problem please let your child's Year Head know.
- b) Early morning closure for the whole day: all should base their actions on the assumption that the school is open unless they hear

otherwise from BBC Radio Suffolk (FM 104.6) or SGR Radio (FM 96.4). If a decision has been taken to close the school it will be relayed on these radio stations by 7.30 am at the latest. There will always be someone at school to handle queries and receive students who didn't hear the closure message. Radio Suffolk will give out information at 10 minutes past the hour and 20 minutes to the hour and SGR will broadcast their information on the hour and half hour. The two stations will also try to keep their websites updated ie. www.bbc.co.uk/suffolk; www.musicradio.com.
