Uniform and other matters: some reminder for the new term.

- Mobile phones and i-pods may be brought into school but must not be visible in lessons, except at the teacher's direction for educational purposes. If they are, they will be confiscated until a parent collects them. The school takes no responsibility for such items and students should continue to hand valuables in during PE lessons.
- Students need to wear the school skirt with plain natural, black, grey or navy tights and it must be a suitable length, especially for the hotter weather when thick tights will not be appropriate.
- Students need not have a jumper at any time **providing they are wearing the school polo shirt** with the County Upper crest, available from reception. It is recommended that all students have the school shirt for the summer term.
- Students without the school polo shirt must continue to wear jumpers. Providing their shirt is plain white, they may ask their teacher's permission to remove their jumpers in individual lessons. Students may not wear cardigans or other tops in place of their jumper.
- Students must wear **plain black shoes.** Backless shoes are unsafe and should not be worn.

- Hair must be a **single, natural colour.** Apart from a maximum of two studs per ear, **no visible piercings** are allowed.
- Sixth form students must adhere to the dress code in the sixth form handbook. 'Ripped jeans' are not acceptable.
